



Local Transport

Barcelona has five metro lines covering a total of 80.5 km with 111 stations. It also has a city railway network which supplements the metro network. A fleet of 840 buses connects all the city's districts. There are a number of travel passes which can be used on public transport (metro, city railway and buses). These are valid for 1,3 or 5 days. Barcelona has a fleet of 11,000 taxis which can be easily identified by their yellow and black livery. A green light on top of the taxi indicates its availability. The Metro is the easiest and fastest way of moving around the city. The nearest station to the Universitat Pompeu Fabra is Ciutadella/Vila Olímpica (line 4- yellow). We look forward to seeing you in Copenhagen in 2007.




