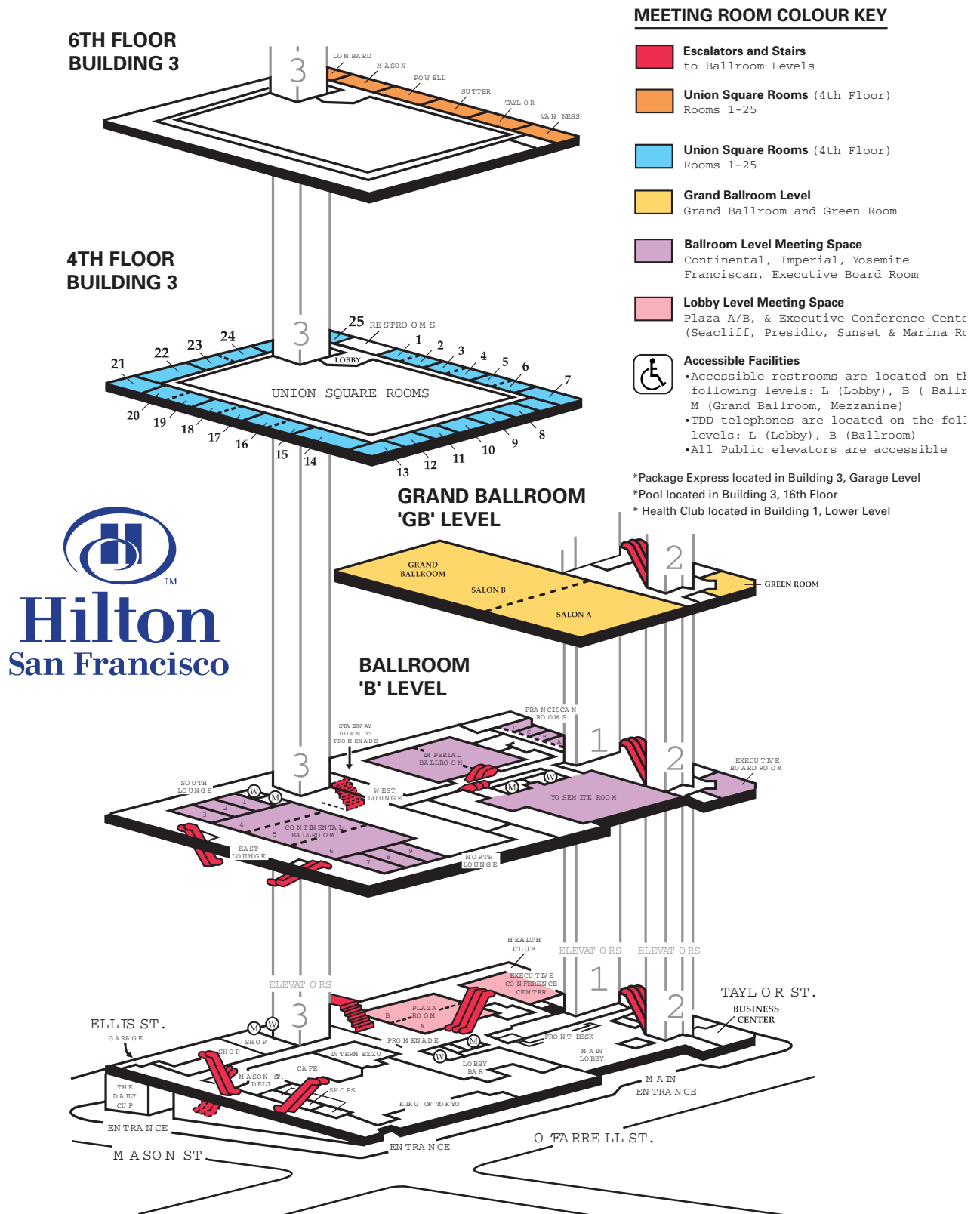

His focus at the World Bank has been on linkages between poverty and health, and has been involved in research, and a variety of World Bank lending and non-lending activities. He has taught on economics and other degree programs, and has been involved in World Bank training activities for Bank staff and country counterparts.</p> <p>Owen O'Donnell is Assistant Professor at the University of Macedonia, Greece. His research is primarily on microeconomic analysis of health data but has also published in the fields of public finance and labour economics. He has a long-standing research interest in equity in health and health care and is currently working on related issues in Asian countries. He has substantial teaching experience in both economics and quantitative methods.</p> <p>Eddy van Doorslaer is a Professor of Health Economics at the Department of Health Policy and Management of Erasmus University Rotterdam. He has published widely on the measurement of equity in health and health care and has gained experience in the application of these methods to a large number of developed and developing countries in projects sponsored by the European Union, the OECD and the World Bank.</p> <p>John R. Cook, Ph.D. Dr. Cook joined Merck Research Laboratories in 1989 as a biometrician providing statistical support to the worldwide health economic research programs undertaken by Merck. His primary focus has been evaluating the impact of pharmaceuticals (for cardiovascular disease, HIV/AIDS, and osteoporosis) and vaccines on health outcomes and cost. More recently, he has provided oversight to the other products supported by the department. His present position is Senior Director, Scientific Staff, Health Economic Statistics. Educationally, John received B.S. and M.S. degrees in both Statistics and Sociology from Iowa State University and his Ph.D. in Statistics from North Carolina State University. His research interests include developing economic models for disease, incorporating statistical assessments of uncertainty in economic analyses and statistical methods for analyzing data collected longitudinally in time.</p>

Heyse, Ph.D. Dr. Heyse joined Merck Research Laboratories in 1976 as a statistician supporting the Pre-clinical and Safety Assessment research programs. In 1985 he was asked to provide statistical support to worldwide health economic research programs being undertaken by the Company. This work led to the establishment of a Health Economics Statistics Department under Joe's direction in 1999. The Department has responsibility for providing technical statistical and economic support to Merck research programs in Quality of Life and Pharmacoeconomics. In 1994 Joe was given additional responsibility for supporting statistical aspects of Phase I-V clinical development programs for drug and vaccine projects at the Blue Bell site. He is currently Executive Director of Vaccine Biostatistics. Academically, Joe received B.S. and M.S. degrees in Mathematics at Villanova University, an MBA from Temple University, and a Ph.D. in Statistics, also from Temple. His research interests are in economic evaluations of health care and statistical methods for multiple comparisons/multiple endpoints, and longitudinal data models. He is an Adjunct Professor of Statistics at Temple and Villanova and has served on three Ph.D. Dissertation Committees. He was elected Fellow of the American Statistical Association in 1997.</p> <p>George W. Carides, Ph.D. Dr. Carides was employed by Merck as an outside statistical consultant from 1994 to 1998. He then joined Merck Research Laboratories in 1998 as a biometrician providing statistical support to the worldwide health economic research programs undertaken by Merck. George's primary focus has been evaluating the impact of pharmaceuticals for cardiovascular and renal disease on health outcomes and cost. He has also provided support for studies in various other therapeutic areas, including HIV/AIDS, migraine, arthritis, obesity, and cancer. His present position is Senior Biometrician, Health Economic Statistics. George received a B.S. degree in Economics from The College of New Jersey, and an M.A. degree in Economics from the University of Chicago. International National Health Accounts (NHA) Symposium

Measuring today, planning for tomorrow

The National Health Accounts (NHA) Symposium is a unique opportunity for policymakers, country experts, and health economists from around the world to learn about the benefits of NHA and its latest developments. The Symposium provides the only international forum to discuss on a global scale the benefits of health accounts and the latest methodological developments.

Held biannually in collaboration with IHEA, the Symposium is co-funded by the US Agency for International Development (USAID) Partners for Health Reformplus (PHRplus) Project and the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida). This year's Symposium (June 13-14th 2003) focuses on the policy impact of NHA, the status of the regional NHA networks, and methodological advances of the tool. One of the highlights of this Symposium is the release of the long anticipated multi-donor sponsored NHA Producer's Guide, which recommends strategies for implementing health accounts in the developing country context.

NHA is an internationally accepted tool for summarizing, describing, and analyzing the financing of national health systems – including public, private, and donor expenditures. Such information is useful to the decision-making process because it assesses current use of financial resources, tracks health spending trends over time, and allows comparison of the country's health system performance relative to other countries. The NHA framework can also be adapted to measure specific health expenditures, such as those relating to the delivery of HIV/AIDS services or maternal and child health care services.

To date, NHA has been conducted in approximately 70 countries worldwide. NHA country networks are fully established in regions of Latin American and Caribbean, Asia Pacific, East and Southern Africa, and Middle East and North Africa. Efforts are underway to promote NHA and establish networks with the countries in Central and West Africa, Central Europe, and the Commonwealth of Independent States.
