

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

#### **Ian Robertson**

lan Robertson is Professor of Psychology at Trinity College Dublin and was the founding Director of Trinity College Institute of Neuroscience. He is a member of the Royal Irish Academy. Previously a senior scientist at the MRC Cognition and Brain Sciences Unit in Cambridge, where he was also a fellow at Hughes Hall, Ian Robertson continues to be a Visiting Professor at University College London, University of Wales at Bangor and is a Visiting Scientist at the Rotman Research Institute, University of Toronto. A graduate of Glasgow University, he gained his Masters and Doctoral degrees at the University of London.

His research focusses on the neuropsychology of brain rehabilitation and attention: he has more than 200 published books and articles in this field. A former science writer for the London Times, his multiply-translated popular science books include Mind Sculpture and the Mind's Eye. Robertson is author and editor of ten scientific books, including the leading international textbook on cognitive rehabilitation (Cognitive Neurorehabilitation), and two books for the general reader (Mind Sculpture: Unleashing Your Brain's Potential and The Mind's Eye: The Essential Guide to Boosting Your Mental, Emotional and Physical Powers), which have been translated into multiple languages. Robertson's latest book is The Winner Effect: How Power Affects Your Brain, published by Bloomsbury (7 June 2012).

#### James P. Smith

James P. Smith holds the Distinguished Chair in Labor Markets and Demographic Studies at the RAND Corporation. He has studied immigration, the economics of aging, black-white wages and employment, the effects of economic development on labor markets, wealth accumulation and savings behavior, the interrelation of health and economic status, and the effects of attrition and nonresponse in the National Institute on Aging's Health and Retirement Study (HRS). He is principal investigator for the New Immigrant Survey, which yields adequate sample size of the foreign-born, has known sampling properties, permits longitudinal analyses, and can answer policy questions of relevance to immigration.

Smith chaired the Panel on Demographic and Economic Impacts of Immigration (1995–1997), the Committee on Population, and the Committee on National Statistics, National Academy of Sciences. He has been an invited speaker before the President's Initiative on Race in Phoenix, the Federal Reserve Board of Los Angeles, and the Prime Minister and members of Parliament of New Zealand, among many others. Smith has twice received the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Merit Award, the most distinguished honor NIH grants to a researcher. In 2013, Smith received an honorary degree of Doctor of the University from the University of Stirling, Scotland; in 2011, he was elected to the Institute of Medicine; and in 2009, he received the Ulysses Medal from University College Dublin. Smith received his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago.

Pre-Congress: Regulating Private Finance of Health Care to Achieve Access and Quality A Cross-Country Comparison

**Chair:** Robyn Tamblyn (CIHR Institute of Health Services and Policy Research) Organized by the CIHR Institute of Health Services and Policy Research

Countries around the world have different approaches to the role of private finance within their health care systems. Some systems, in an attempt to achieve universal access, have introduced mandates for the purchase of private health insurance (e.g. the US, Taiwan, and the Netherlands). In other systems, private purchase of services that are available within the public system is allowed, often with the goal of improving timely access to care or to address concerns abut quality (e.g. Ireland, the United Kingdom, Australia and New Zealand). A current court case in Canada is challenging laws that prevent a parallel private pay system for publicly insured physician and hospital services. If successful, it could pave the way for radical reform of the Canadian health system. Different countries take different approaches to both the role of private finance within their respective systems and to the regulatory/policy tools to limit or permit its role. Questions arise vis-à-vis the extent to which regulation of the private sector (e.g. regulating prices, extra billing, physicians' time in private practice) can be an effective tool for mitigating potential unintended consequences and ensuring equity of access to high-quality care in both public and private systems. What does health services research evidence presently tell us about the impact of a parallel private tier and private finance more broadly on health services research evidence?

This pre-conference session will feature health economists, legal scholars and health services researchers from around the world who will present the latest evidence on the rationale for, approaches to, and impacts of regulation of private finance and, further, evaluate how courts have or are likely to respond to such evidence in different legal challenges. The session chair, Dr. Robyn Tamblyn, will engage participants in evidence-informed discussion and debate.

Chair and Organizer: James Burgess (Boston University)

This session on teaching in health economics contains three papers on methods for conveying key concepts and three papers on new advanced modalities. All health economics teachers should find useful tips and methods in this session. The session will be highly interactive with discussion following each of the six papers. The key concepts in the first three papers are understanding how to teach about the generation of Quality Adjusted Life Years (QALYs), applications of neoclassical economics to healthcare markets, and the roles of nurses and clinical nurse leaders in hospital settings using case studies. The new advanced modalities to be discussed are simulations of research conference interactions for bachelor level students, team based learning methods for health care administration students, and testing of classroom flipping and peer-to-peer instruction techniques. Professor Jim Burgess will chair, comment, and lead the discussions on the papers.

# 2015–16 HARKNESS FELLOWSHIPS in HEALTH CARE POLICY and PRACTICE

### CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Commonwealth Fund invites promising mid-career professionals—government policymakers, academic researchers, clinical leaders, hospital and insurance managers, and journalists—from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Sweden, and the United Kingdom—to apply for a unique opportunity to spend up to 12 months in the United States as a Harkness Fellow in Health Care Policy and Practice.

Fellows are placed with mentors who are leading U.S. experts at organizations such as Harvard University, Stanford University, Kaiser Permanente, and the Institute for Healthcare Improvement to study issues relevant to the Fund's mission to support a high performing health care system–insurance coverage, access, and affordability; health care delivery system reforms (e.g. bundled payments, accountable care organizations, innovative approaches to care for high need/high cost patients); cost containment; and other

critical issues on the health policy agenda in both the U.S. and their home countries. A peer-reviewed journal article or policy report for Health Ministers and other high-level policy audiences is the anticipated product of the fellowship. Harkness Fellows have published their findings in top-tier journals, including: *BMJ*, *Health Affairs*, and *New England Journal of Medicine*.

The Commonwealth Fund brings together the full class of Fellows throughout the year to participate in a series of high level policy briefings and leadership seminars with U.S. health care leaders.

Each fellowship will provide up to U.S. \$119,000 in support, with an additional supplemental family allowance (approximately \$55,000 for partner and two children up to age 18).

The Harkness Fellowship provided me with a wealth of opportunities that have significantly impacted my professional development and brought me into the fold of the international health research community. While in the United States, I was placed at a preeminent university, where I developed a research project on long-term care and quality with my mentor. Throughout the Harkness Fellowship, I gained unparalleled access to U.S. and international health experts, including, for example, the chance to have breakfast with the German Minister of Health at the International Symposium, which subsequently led to an invitation to report the results of my research project to the Ministry of Health once back in Germany. Only through the extensive support from the Commonwealth Fund would this have been possible.
